Captain David R. Street, Jr.

Captain Street, a native of Baton Rouge Louisiana, is a designated aeromedical officer and naval Aerospace Experimental Psychologist. He attained the Bachelor of Science from Arizona State University in 1977 and the Master of Arts (1980) and the Doctorate of Education (1984) from Northern Arizona University. He is a 1994 graduate of the Naval War College, a member of the Defense Acquisition Corps, trained Lean Six Sigma Black Belt and licensed Psychologist.



His military assignments include Principal Investigator at the Naval Aerospace Medical Research Laboratory from 1991 to 1994, Training Systems Program Manager for night vision device systems with the Naval Air Systems Command (PMA205 Aviation Training Systems) from 1994 to 1997, and Deputy Head of the Human Systems Integration Branch for the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Manpower and Personnel (OPNAV N125) from 1997 to 2000. In 2000 he became the Program Officer for Force Health Protection Research at the Office of Naval Research where he served until 2003. He served as Research and Development Liaison to the Navy Surgeon General (OPNAV N931) from 2003 to 2005, and then as Executive Officer and later Officer in Charge of the Naval Aerospace Medical Research Laboratory from 2005 to 2008. He reported as Strategic Business Advisor to the Director, Navy Medicine Research and Development from 2008 to 2009. In 2009 he reported as Program Director for Advanced Development to the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs, Force Health Protection and Readiness (DASD FHP&R) where he managed the Defense-wide advanced medical development program from until 2011. His most recent assignment was as Deputy Director of the Office of Strategy Management for the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED M5) from 2011-2014.

Captain Street is currently assigned as the Deputy Command Surgeon for the United States Transportation. His military specialties include executive medicine, managed care coordinator, researcher, program management, Joint professional military education, and education training management.

His personal decorations include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (three awards), the Navy Commendation Medal (five awards) and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal.
