### Discussion

- 1) Technical Secretary Report: X12
  - a) Last Meeting
    - i) 15 Sept 19 Sept 2019 Onsite is Pittsburgh, PA
    - ii) Standing meeting for all Transportation subcommittee activities
    - iii) Meeting minutes have been submitted to ASC X12 web site
      - (1) Minutes available upon request
  - b) Next Meeting
    - i) 26-30 January, 2020
    - ii) Portland, OR
  - c) X12 Data maintenance
    - i) X12I (Transportation) activities
      - (1) The task group reviewed nine (9) maintenance request (MR) items
        - (a) 6 approved
        - (b) 3 deferred
    - ii) Approved one request for information (RFI)
  - d) Way Ahead
    - i) 2020 Initiatives: X12 is establishing alliances with the BlockChain Transport association (BiTA). At the moment, there is significant push-back by BiTA members to standardize codes—each member wants to use its own code tables. At the moment,

it does not appear likely BiTA will standardize code values, limiting its usefulness across the transportation domain.

- 2) Technical Secretary Report: F-35 Global Transportation and Distribution Support
  - a) DTEB Support is assisting with developing automated EDI-based transactions to support the F-35 Supply effort.
  - b) The following ICs are being considered for the service
    - i) 219B
    - ii) 219D
    - iii) 220B
    - iv) 220D
    - v) 858R
    - vi) 856S
  - c) Ms. Bratcher (IGC) asked what's unique about supporting the F-35 weapon system compared to other weapon systems.
  - d) Mr. Napoli answered that it is the fact that F-35 requires a transition from commercialcontrolled to DOD-controlled Supply processes.
- 3) Technical Secretary Report: Multimodal 3
  - a) DTEB Support is assisting with identifying the best path forward to ensuring ITV is met
  - b) The following ICs are being considered for the service
    - i) 315A
    - ii) New variant?
  - c) Mr. Bringenberg added that these air-only movements are not IBS-booked, and that the change to allow POE to accept APOEs and POD to accept APODs might impact systems downstream.
- 4) Technical Secretary Report: DFTS
  - a) DFTS is supporting FEMA during the current Hurricane Season through the use of standard DFTS ICs, not use of the 856F/214F.
  - b) DTEB support to DFTS has reduced to monthly system engineering IPT meetings
  - c) GFM (in support of DCMA) is seeking to change their processes to allow changes to shipments to be made after the 220D has been sent by the 3PL. The business rules for these changes are being worked by the DFTS PMO.
    - i) 219D and 858R with transaction purpose code '04' is the current EDI solution.
    - ii) Currently on hold due to business rule questions being addressed by PMO according to Mr. Mannino.
  - d) No significant changes to DTEB ICs from DFTS since the last DTEB Committee Meeting
- 5) Technical Secretary Report: FEMA
  - a) FEMA and DLA have completed testing the exchange of the 856F and have begun preparations for exchanging the 214F
  - b) DLA requested DTEB support with implementing the 214 exchange
  - c) DTEB is actively monitoring this situation
  - d) Mr. Napoli requested that EBSO be included when DTEB contacts FEMA/DLA for status updates. Mr. Eric Flannagan is lead on this effort in their office.
- 6) Technical Secretary Report: TMS
  - a) BLUF: DTEB has supported TMS by interpreting EDI information streams

- i) Nine DTEB EDI transaction sets currently in use
- b) Background/Timeline: Timeline for TMS POP Release 1.2 (CONUS to/from Hawaii)
  - i) Jul TCAIMS II: Deploy/Re-deploy: Schofield Barracks to Ft. Polk
    - ii) Aug DLA Sustainment: DDPW => DDJC=> DDPH
    - iii) Sep AAFES: Booking and Distribution PACOM wide
    - iv) Oct DLA and Navy: Booking and Distribution PACOM wide
- c) Data Challenges
  - i) Requirements Definition for Master Data
  - ii) Requirements Definition for Transactional Data
  - iii) Lessons Learned from Prototype Data
- 7) Technical Secretary Report: X12 Version 008010
  - a) Does the DTEB Committee want to purchase 008010 and begin converting all ICs to new version?
    - i) Pros:
      - (1) Allows DTEB to address various issues that have been introduced into the ICs over the years (IE: mixing code lists 150 and 152)
      - (2) Allows DTEB to begin compliance with EDMO standards without impacting legacy interfaces.
      - (3) Allows DTEB to consider alternatives to repurposing codes (IE: requesting new codes from X12 when needed.)
      - (4) Allows DTEB to separate Business Partner and Location information without impacting legacy ICs.
    - ii) Cons:
      - (1) Implementing the new ICs will require money.
      - (2) Converting the old ICs to a new version will require a significant time investment.
      - (3) Changes to code lists will require significant analysis.
  - b) Mr. Napoli warned DTEB to consider the impact moving to a new version of X12 would have on external systems that rely on transportation data, such as Supply and Financial systems.
  - c) Mr. DeCarli noted that further consideration on the matter will be needed.
- 8) Technical Secretary Wrap-up
  - a) June Meeting Minutes were approved for publication.
  - b) No further questions from the committee on the Technical Secretary report.
- 9) DM & IC Update
  - a) 5 DMs submitted for DTEB review since last DTEB Committee meeting
    - i) 4 Approved by Member Vote
    - ii) 1 Withdrawn by Submitter
  - b) No further discussion requested by Committee

- b) DTEB Support recommended removing ONE TMS due to it being specific to the DTCI contract, which is no longer active.
- c) Mr. Griffin suggested adding USBank and TPPS to the sync chart and stated that he would provide a POC after the meeting.
- d) DTEB Support took an action item to send an email out to the Committee about these changes and requesting information about any other changes.

11) 858R Accessorial Table Review

- a) DTEB 858R Code Value Working Group met 8 May 2019 intending to review the Service Unit Qualifiers and Service Rate Qualifiers associated with Accessorials in the 858R.
  - i) Since our previous Committee meeting, Key Subject Matter Experts (SME) have been reviewing the materials
  - ii) Very time consuming effort that involved multiple inputs from constituents
  - iii) Working copy of Section 6 is available upon request
- b) A follow-up meeting will be scheduled if necessary; otherwise, a DM containing the recommended changes will be submitted for Committee review.
- c) Mr. Mannino noted that it would be nice to lock everyone involved in a room to address the matter, but that's not feasible.

12) Data Governance Efforts

- a) Two Data Governance efforts are under way that will directly interact with DTEB Committee members.
- b) Data Stewards Initiative to officially identify the primary POC for data-related issues for Systems/Programs/Initiatives (SPI).
- c) Standard Terms Initiative to create an Enterprise data dictionary utilizing definitions and data specs from Authoritative Sources. Standard definitions and data specs could impact the content of the DTEB ICs in the long run
- d) Mr. Napoli recommended contacting Sylvia Williams to coordinate Standard Terms initiatives.
- 13) 858D Shipping Cost in Accessorial Loop
  - a) HL (Accessorial Service Description Loop)
    - i) HL Segment Accessorial Service Description
    - ii) Loop ID L0 (Accessorial Service)
    - iii) L0 Segment Accessorial Service
    - iv) L1 Segment Accessorial Service Charge
    - v) L1 Segment Shipping Cost
  - b) There is no explanation for how the bolded L1 segment should be populated or why it was created within the IC.
  - c) Is this utilized by any systems?
  - d) How is it utilized?
  - e) If it is not utilized, can a DM removing this L1 segment be submitted to eliminate the confusion?
  - f) DTEB support staff took an action item to send an email requesting input on this question from the broader DTEB community.

14) Rail ACI

a) 417/418 Implementation

- i) iSDDC is looking to implement 417 and 418 for Rail shipments.
- ii) Mr. Bringenberg noted that the 417/418 is currently being created by the Rail Carriers, but not being sent to USTRANSCOM. It is used to track trains and not just railcars.
- b) GFM-Rail ACI Interface Requirements Agreement (IRA)
  - i) GFM has requested DTEB support in reviewing an update to an IRA between GFM and members of the Rail ACI.
  - ii) It has been around 10 years since the last Rail ACI, so the members list is dated. DTEB support has begun efforts to re-connect with the key members.
    - (1) SDDC
    - (2) CMOS
    - (3) GFM
    - (4) EBSO
    - (5) Norfolk Southern
    - (6) American Short Line and Regional Railroad Association

- (7) BNSF(8) Union Pacific
- (9) CSX

- c) Ms. Bratcher noted that 81 rail carriers send IGC data.
- d) Ms. Verdu noted that the IRA does not warrant an ACI meeting on its own. Most likely an email or a quick conference call would suffice.
- e) Mr. Napoli recommended contacting Chris Hight from the ARA (rail lobbying organization).
- f) Mr. DeCarli noted that further investigation into whether DTEB is the appropriate group to establish the rail ACI meeting is required.
- 15) Transportation Mode vs Method
  - a) EBSO is currently looking at replacing all references to "Transportation Mode Code" with "Transportation Method Code" in DLMS ICs.
    - i) Transportation Mode is sourced from the DTR folk goes way back to MILSTAMP days. This is used in non-EDI DTR required transactions
    - ii) The Transportation Method is from the X12 EDI standard linked to the DTR Transportation Method to associate the various codes to each other
    - iii) They are separate codes created separately. They are interrelated but they are not a one to one match.
  - b) EBSO wants DTEB feedback before moving forward with their Proposed DLMS Change (PDC).
    - i) Making the change will require systems changes how significant is currently unknown.
    - ii) The two code lists are very similar; eliminating Mode will remove some confusion.
  - c) There was lots of discussion on this topic, but it seemed the consensus was twofold:
    - i) These codes are confusing (more so when Billing Mode is thrown into the mix)
    - ii) Fixing the problem will require lots of systems changes.
  - d) Final decisions on the PDC will be made once it is released and official taskings related to it can be sent out.
