During the IOCC user requests process, the above PII is retrieved as part of the required process of ensuring accountability and authentication while using IOCC. Retention of this data is maintained for the length that the user requires access to IOCC. Upon notification that the user no longer requires access to IOCC, and or the user is removed from TEAMS, the user's PII will be removed from the IOCC system. In conjunction to accountability and authentication, the user's PII as mentioned above, can be viewed on the IOCC site by IOCC administrators.
